DETAILED ITINERARY, June 1 – 14 Tour

Day 1: Arrival

You will arrive in Anchorage today and take the Comfort Inn's free shuttle to your hotel. For those who arrive early enough, the group will meet in the lobby and then go as a group for a welcome dinner at 7:00 PM.

Day 2: Anchorage Birding

Today we will visit some of the best birding spots around Anchorage, including Potter Marsh, Westchester Lagoon, Eagle River Nature Center and Turnagain Arm (where we have a chance of seeing Beluga Whales!). Some of the target species for today include Arctic Tern, Greater and Lesser Yellowlegs, American Dipper, and Bohemian Waxwing, among others.

Day 3: Anchorage to Nome

We will take an early morning (6:00 AM) flight to Nome, providing we can get seats once we have received all registrations and deposits for this tour. If no seats are available when we are ready to make reservations, we will have to take an evening flight (so get those forms and deposits to us as soon as possible!). Once in Nome, we will travel in two SUVs to explore the area.

Days 4 – 5: Nome



We will explore three main roads leading out of Nome to find as many of the local specialties as possible. Nome-Council Road and Kougatok Road (Nome-Taylor Highway) are the two most important, so we'll concentrate our time there. We hope to find Arctic and Yellow-billed Loons, Bristle-thighed Curlew, Bar-tailed Godwit, Red-necked Stint, Bluethroat, Eastern Yellow Wagtail, White Wagtail, Arctic Warbler, and Northern Wheatear, among many others.

Day 6 Nome – Anchorage

We will catch an evening flight back to Anchorage, using the morning and afternoon to try to sweep up any species we might have missed. Upon arrival in Anchorage, we'll head straight to our hotel and check in for a good night's sleep before heading off to Denali in the morning.

Day 7: Anchorage - Denali

We will drive from Anchorage to Denali along the Parks Highway through boreal forest, stopping en route at likely birding spots. Boreal wetland species like Horned Grebe, Rusty Blackbird, and Blackpoll Warblers are likely in and around forest ponds. Forest species like Varied Thrush and Townsend's Warblers are also likely, among many others.

Day 8: Denali National Park

The only way to access Denali National Park beyond the first 12 miles of the Park Road is via the park shuttle buses. We will take a shuttle in as far as Eielson Visitor Center, located in the most dramatic section of the road. We'll spend a few hours birding in the area around the visitors' center, where we're likely to find Arctic Warbler, Northern Wheatear, Golden Eagle, Gyrfalcon, Long-tailed Jaeger, Rock and Willow Ptarmigans, and of course, chances to see Grizzlies, Caribou, Moose, and maybe even Wolves!

Day 9: Denali Area

Today we'll explore the area near Denali along the western half of the Denali Highway. We'll try to make it as far as the Maclaren River, but how much we will be able to cover will depend on the time spent birding along the way, and the group's preferences. Target species in this area include Merlin, Wandering Tattler, Gray-cheeked Thrush, Boreal Chickadee, Canada Jay, Trumpeter Swan, Olive-sided Flycatcher, and many more.

Day 10: Denali - Anchorage

We will drive from Denali Anchorage today, along the same Parks Highway through boreal forest, stopping en route at likely birding spots to try to find species we might have missed on the way up.

Day 11: Anchorage - Seward

We'll drive to Seward today, a 2 – 3 hour journey from Anchorage that will likely take longer as we stop to bird along the way. We'll make a stop at Turnagain Arm for another chance to spot the increasingly rare Belugas, and we'll stop at Tern Lake for Arctic Tern, swans, waterfowl, and boreal shorebirds.

Day 12: Seward

We have scheduled a full-day private boat tour for our group. We'll visit Resurrection Bay and Kenai Fjords National Park as we search for Horned and Tufted Puffins, Marbled, Kittlitz's and Ancient Murrelets, and Rhinoceros Auklet, to name but a few.

We will explore the area around Seward today, including a behind-the-scenes tour of the Sea Life Center. Of course, you can't visit this area without seeing Exit Glacier, so we'll also spend some time there.

Barrow Extension

Day 1 (June 14): Arrive in Barrow

The group will fly to Barrow on a 3:05 PM flight. If you are going on the first Alaska tour, you will arrive from Seward in time for the flight. If you are taking the second tour, you will need to arrive in Anchorage by 1:00 PM in order to make this flight.

Day 2 (June 15): Half-day cultural tour / Birding

Barrow, Alaska is the northernmost city in the United States and offers visitors a unique experience of the Arctic region. While touring the Inupiat village you will visit culturally specific destinations meeting indigenous Eskimos of the Arctic region. You may witness and experience traditional events and customs. The guide will walk you through the tundra to the ancient remains of the sod huts, stop at iconic sites such as the whalebone arches and the historically registered whaling post. You might even want to dip your toes and fingers into the Arctic Ocean, earning a **Polar Bear Plunge Certificate**. Keep your eye out for the diverse wildlife: polar bears, a variety of whales, walrus, seals, Snowy Owls, and more.



Imagine tapping your foot to traditional drumming, watching the movement of the fur covered mitts, the bouncing pom-poms of the beaded hide mukluks and being invited to dance the native dances during the cultural performance. You will hear the accent of the Eskimos as they generously share with you to describe their history, their art, their way of life through their stories in song.

During the tour through the Inupiat Heritage Center, the guide will share with you about migration patterns, neighboring villages, subsistence living, festivals, and celebrations. In the traditional room, you may watch Inupiat artisans hone their skills while making tools, crafting native art or possibly working on their umiaqs for whaling season. Experience the Arctic hands-on.

After our half-day cultural tour, we will spend the remainder of the day birding in the area with our birding guide.
