#### SUMMER BIRDING IN COLORADO

Cindy and I spent a week in Colorado in late July visiting family in Pueblo and doing some birding. From a birding perspective, we were on a quest. Despite being in many prime western US birding locations over the past 15 years, we have continually missed the American Three-toed Woodpecker everywhere we birded.

During our visit, we attended the ABA annual meeting and evening barbecue in Colorado Springs. During the barbecue, we asked several local attendees "is there someplace within a reasonable driving distance where we can find a Three-toed Woodpecker?".

We also reached out to SeEtta Moss from the Arkansas Valley Audubon Society Chapter with the same question plus we looked at the 2011 summer history of Three-toed Woodpecker sightings on the Colorado List Serve.

Bottom line, we ended up with 5 different locations to seek this elusive bird; two locations near Beulah, one near Colorado Springs (Old Stage Road) and two west of Denver (Pine Valley and Jefferson). We drove almost 500 miles to visit all 5 sites and we STRUCK OUT. So the QUEST will continue. Next time we are in Colorado, we will drive to Rocky Mountain National Park where the sightings seem more frequent and more reliable.

As we live in Ohio with its abundance of eastern species, it is always exciting to go far enough west to see some of the western species. We were not disappointed. Sightings included Bandtailed Pigeon, Eurasian Collared-Dove, Rufous Hummingbird, Broad-tailed Hummingbird, Williamson's Sapsucker, Cordilleran Flycatcher, Western Wood-Pewee, Western Kingbird, Loggerhead Shrike, Plumbeous Vireo, Steller's Jay, Black-billed Magpie, Mountain Chickadee, Bushtit, Pygmy Nuthatch, Western Bluebird, Sprague's Pipit, Audubon's Warbler, Western Tanager, Spotted Towhee, Oregon Junco, Black-headed Grosbeak, Bullock's Oriole, and Red Crossbill. Not too bad a list considering we were there to spend time with family.

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# **Spotlight Tour - Alaska**

Our **Alaska Introductory Tour** focuses on prime birding locations in and around Denali National Park and the Kenai Peninsula with an optional 5-day **Nome Extension**.

Day 1 Arrive in Anchorage at your convenience. No activities are scheduled for this day.

Day 2 will be spent in Anchorage birding along the Coastal Trail and a possible visit to an Alaska Native culture museum before heading north toward Denali.

Days 3 and 4 will be spent birding and wildlife viewing in Denali and east of Denali.

Day 5 will begin with birding around the lodge before heading south to Anchorage, birding along the way . Days 6 thru 9 will be spent on the Kenai Peninsula with day trips out of Seward. We will visit Turnagain Arm, Kachemak Bay, Resurrection Bay, and the Sealife Center in addition to birding shorelines and forest trails. Day 10 concludes the Introductory Tour and begins the Nome Extension. Those going on the Nome Extension will fly to Nome where we will bird after arrival.

Days 11 thru 13 will be spent birding in and around Nome.

Day 14 will begin with final birding around Nome and then the return flight to Anchorage.

Day 15 – Depart Anchorage

The **Alaska Introductory Tour** is priced at \$3900 per person if we have a group of 6 or \$3350 if we have a group of 8.

- This price includes 9 nights of lodging (days 1 thru 9), all land transportation within Alaska, airport transfers, entrance fees, and an expert birding guide.
- This price does not include roundtrip airfare from your home airport to Anchorage, meals, tips, and expenses of a personal nature such as laundry, phone calls, extra drinks and snacks, souvenirs, etc.

The Nome Extension is priced at \$2258 per person if we have a group of 6 or \$1858 if we have a group of 8.

- This price includes 5 nights of lodging (days 10 thru 14), all land transportation within Alaska, airport transfers, entrance fees, and an expert birding guide.
- This price does not include roundtrip airfare from Anchorage to Nome, meals, tips, and expenses of a personal nature such as laundry, phone calls, extra drinks and snacks, souvenirs, etc.

Some of the key species we are searching for include Red-throated, Arctic and Pacific Loons, Gyrfalcon, Spruce Grouse, Willow and Rock Ptarmigan, Bristle-thighed Curlew, Red Knot, Red-necked Phalarope, Long-tailed Jaeger, Arctic and Aleutian Terns, Horned and Tufted Puffins, Gray Jay, Boreal Chickadee, Arctic Warbler, Bluethroat, Yellow and White Wagtails, and Northern Wheatear.





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# **Highlights of Recent Peru Trip**

**Cheepers!** visited Peru from August 19 thru September 6. During this trip, we birded south of Lima and around Cusco, visited Machu Picchu, birded Manu Road from Cusco to Ithahuania, birded the lodge properties at Cockof-the-Rock Lodge, Amazonia Lodge and Manu Amazon Lodge, visited a parrot lick, and birded the Madres de Dios River from Ithahuania to Laberinto. The group saw 433 species, heard another 38 species and we had 3 counted as fly-bys (as we need better views to see field marks ).

Machu Picchu is an amazing place to visit. Manu Road is definitely not for the faint-of-heart. The boat ride from Manu Amazon Lodge to Laberinto was over 10 hours as the river was low and a lot of zig-zagging was required because of sand bars and tree trunks in the water.

Included in our count were 49 Tanager and Allies species, 43 Tyrant Flycatcher species, 34 Hummingbird species, 27 Ovenbird and Woodcreeper species, 27 Typical Antbird species, and 21 Parrot species.

Highlights included Andean Cock-of-the-Rock (male and female), Amazonian Umbrellabird, Sungrebe, Sunbittern, Orange-eared Tanager, Rufous-crested Coquette, Gould's Jewelfront, Wire-crested Thorntail, Great Potoo, Golden-collared Honeycreeper, Blue-naped Chlorophonia, Razor-billed Curassow, Horned Screamer, Palewinged Trumpeter, Humboldt Penguin, Buckley's Forest-Falcon, Tui and Rose-fronted Parakeets, Curl-crested Aracari, Bamboo Antshrike, Striated Antbird, Many-colored Rush-Tyrant, White-cheeked Tody-Flycatcher, Yungas Manakin, Purplish Jay, Black-goggled Tanager, Paradise Tanager, Black-billed Seedfinch, and Torrent Ducks with ducklings.

We also saw 8 species of monkeys (Brown Capuchin, Common Wooley, Pervian Squirrel, Dusky Titi, Red Howler, White-fronted Capuchin, Monk Saki, and Saddle-backed Tamarin), Agouti, Capybara, Coatimundi, Llama, Peccary, Sloth, Tapir, Tayra, and Viscacha plus dozens of butterflies, several lizards/skinks, and a snake or two.

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## Australia Highlights

#### Eastern Australia - Cairns to Sidney

16 full days of birding along the east coast including in and around Cairns, the Great Barrier Reef, the Daintree River (including a river cruise), the Atherland Tableland, Wooroonooran National Park, Mission Bay, Lamington National Park including 2 nights at O'Reilly's Guesthouse, Girraween National Park, in and around Stanthorpe, a pelagic trip out of Wollongong, Barren Grounds Nature Reserve, the Blue Mountains, and Capertee Valley. Depart from the US on Oct 1 and arrival in Cairns on Oct 3. Bird Eastern Australia from Oct 3 to Oct 18 with departure from Sydney on the 19<sup>th</sup> for the Tasmania Extension or to catch your international flight home.

#### **Tasmania Extension**

We will focus on birding Bruny Island, where all 12 Tasmania endemics can be found, plus we will visit several great birding locations near Hobart. This extension is scheduled for Oct19 thru 23, 2012, with a return flight from Hobart to Sydney arriving in Sydney with time to spare before boarding your international flight home.

## **Brazil Highlights**

Brazil! From the tiny Minute Hermit to the flightless Rhea, Brazil is home to over 1700 species of birds in 72 families and is considered one of the top birding destinations in the world. Our Brazilian tour includes three biomes in the main tour and a fourth in the extension: Amazonia, Cerrado, Pantanal, and Atlantic Forests. Located in Brazil's southern Amazonia, Cristalino Lodge will serve as our home away from home during our 5-day pre-trip extension as we explore pristine terra firme forest that harbors rich diversity in an area where two rivers separate many bird populations. Our main tour begins in Cuiaba where we will enjoy birding in the beautiful Cerrado landscape of Chapada dos Guimaraes. This Brazilian savanna features many waterfalls and steep sandstone formations and is home to a wide variety of species. The Pantanal, the world's largest freshwater wetland, has a variety of ecological sub-regions such as river corridors, gallery forest, perennial and seasonal wetlands, and lakes. We expect to see over 100 species a day birding in open areas where finding birds is much easier than in typical tropical birding conditions. The main tour finishes with several days in the Atlantic Forest, a unique ecosystem that harbors more of Brazil's 182 endemic species than any other biome. Come with us to experience the biodiversity of Brazil!

### Ecuador options if you have already birded Northern Ecuador

If you have birded Northern Ecuador but haven't experienced the Ecuador Amazon Basin or the Galapagos, consider joining **Cheepers!** for the Feb 24–28 2012 Amazon Basin Extension and/or the Mar 1–10 2012 Galapagos Island Hopping trips. These two trips can easily be combined and we can arrange day activities for you on Feb 29. NOTE: Current Amazon Basin pricing does not include lodging and meals in Quito on February 23 or the flight from Quito and Coca to meet the group heading down the Napo River and the return flight from Coca to Quito on February 28. Contact us for more details.

The Galapagos Island Hopping and Southwest Ecuador trips can also be combined. Fly into Guayaquil for the flight to the Galapagos, then return to Guayaquil for the start of the Southwest trip. The Southwest trip ends in Guayaquil where you can connect with your international flight home. Of, if you want to spend time in Quito either before or after these trips, you can fly into Quito and then to the Galapagos and return to Quito after your Galapagos and/or Southwest trips are completed. We can arrange birding/sight-seeing activities for you in Quito if you arrive before March 10 and/or stay later than March 24.

## Panama Canopy Tower and Canopy Lodge – Price Comparison

Compare the Cheepers! price for this tour to the big tour companies. The per day cost of the **Cheepers!** 2012 Canopy tour is \$216 vs. approximately \$350 to \$375 per day for Field Guides, VENT and Wings. There are some differences in sites visited and in time of year of year visited, but we are staying at the same places, eating the same meals, using the same guides, and generally seeing the same resident birds.

### **Trip Cancellation Policy**

Sometimes, you have to cancel out of a trip after you have registered for the trip. If this happens, please notify *Cheepers!* in writing, either postal mail or email.

If notice of cancellation is received at Cheepers!:

- at least 6 months in advance, your deposit is fully refunded.
- between 4 and 6 months of the trip, 50% of your deposit is refunded.
- less than 4 months prior to your trip, 0% of your deposit is refunded

If cancellation occurs after full payment is made, a refund will be given only if the vacant spot is filled.





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#### **Cheepers!** - Scheduled Custom Trips

*Cheepers!* **custom tours** are normally led by Jim and/or Cindy, depending on the preferences of the group arranging the tour. When the tour is led by the Beckmans, all of the services provided in escorted tours are available to the group. If the group opts to schedule an unescorted tour, we do all we can to ensure that their needs will be met by carefully planning every facet of the tour and arranging for a highly qualified local guide. The trip coordinator would then assume the duties as tour leader, in which case *Cheepers!* would not be able to provide the final list of sightings, the DVD of photos, or the trip report at the end of the tour.

#### Apr 2012 - Panama Canal Zone & Chiriqui Highlands

This standard itinerary offers opportunities to bird in most of the habitats that Panama has to offer. We will search the protected wet rainforests, mangroves, wetlands, and dry forests of the Canal Zone before we fly to the Chiriqui Highlands to search for Resplendent Quetzels and other birds of the cloud forest. The group should see 325 to 350 species on this trip. Cindy is leading this trip.

#### Apr 2012 – Texas (Upper Texas Coast and Hill Country)

We start this custom 9-day trip with a visit to the Attwater Prairie Chicken National Wildlife Refuge during the annual Prairie Chicken Festival. Then we head east to bird the Sam Houston National Forest, Jones State Forest, Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge, Bolivar Peninsula, and High Island. After visiting these Upper Texas Coast hotspots, we drive to the Texas Hill Country and bird Kerr Wildlife Management Area, South Llano River State Park, Lost Maples State Natural Area, and Garner State Park. Jim is leading this trip.

#### Sep 2012 – Northern Ecuador & the Amazon Basin

This is a custom 11-day itinerary jam-packed with many of the best Ecuador birding locations including Yanacocha, Old Nono-Mindo Road, the Antpitta Reserve, an Oilbird roost, Tandayapa Valley, Calacali, Antisana Reserve, Papallacta Pass, Guango, and the Napo Wildlife Center. Jim and Cindy are leading this trip.

### New Product – S4GEAR LockDown Optics Deployment System

During the recently completed Midwest Birding Symposium in Lakewood, OH, I occasionally stepped away from the *Cheepers!* booth to walk around and see what other vendors were offering. I ended up purchasing a new strap for my binoculars, a product called LockDown Optics Deployment System.

I currently use a conventional cross-the-back harness that I find very comfortable and keeps my binoculars from bouncing around (some movement does take place). I do occasionally bump my binoculars getting in and out of vans or busses and I have to remember to cover my binoculars when it starts to rain.



I will be field-testing this new strap on our upcoming South Africa and Ecuador trips and will document my evaluation in a newsletter later this year. What really influenced my decision to buy this system is the pliable cover for a low profile fit (which provides protection from the rain and from bumps) and the ShockCord Security Straps that fasten the optics for maximum security. I will have to get used to the fit as this system hooks around the waist vs. the more conventional harness which has straps that go over your shoulder and under your arm plus this system is a little more bulky.
