Day oo - o, September 28 - 29: Travel

You will leave the US on September 28, losing a day as you travel across the international date line, arriving in Melbourne on September 30. We recommend that you consider arriving a day early (depart on Sept. 27 to arrive on Sept. 29) to allow time to rest from the long fight and to begin to acclimate to the time change. We will arrange for lodging for you if you opt to arrive on September 29 and include the cost on your final invoice.

Day 1, September 30: Arrival in Melbourne, West of Melbourne and Port Phillip Bay

Once everyone has arrived, we will drive west through open plains and low rugged hills where open country and bushland remnants hold a wide variety of birdlife. We'll also visit some wetland sites near Port Phillip Bay, which will make for an action-packed afternoon. Expected bird species include Crimson and Eastern Rosella, Red-rumped Parrot, Purple-crowned Lorikeet, Cape Barren Goose, Latham's Snipe, Shining Bronze Cuckoo, Weebill, Spotted Pardalote, Scarlet Robin, and Striated Fieldwren, among others. We're sure to see some migratory shorebirds, with Red-necked Avocets and Black-winged Stilts in the mix.

Day 2, October 1: Surf Coast and Bellarine Peninsula

Today we have the full day to explore the coastline, forests and heathlands of the Surf Coast and the Bellarine Peninsula (including the Greater Otway NP). This region is known to have one of the highest bird diversities in the state. A variety of fresh and brackish wetlands, sandy beaches and rocky coastlines, heathlands and eucalypt forests will bring new sightings throughout the day, plus wonderful scenery. The very localized endemic Rufous Bristlebird will be one of many target birds. Other birds may include Hooded Plover, Blue-winged Parrot,

Southern Emu-wren, Striated Fieldwren, Fantailed and Shining Bronze-cuckoo, Crested Shrike-tit, Bassian Thrush, Gang-Gang Cockatoo, Australian King Parrot, Satin Bowerbird, Dusky Woodswallow, and a whole host of Honeyeaters, including White-eared, White-naped, Tawny-crowned and Crescent Honeyeaters.

Day 3, October 2: East of Melborne, Dandedong Ranges National Park

Leaving Geelong early, we will take the freeway straight through to the eastern side of Melbourne. We can make some targeted birding stops on the way through the eastern suburbs where roosting Owls (i.e. Sooty and Powerful Owls) or Tawny Frogmouths may be possible to find, as well as a range of Parrots and waterbirds. Other possible bird species include Musk Lorikeet, Rose Robin, Crescent Honeyeater, Superb Lyrebird, Eastern Whipbird, Striated Thornbill Eastern, Yellow Robin, Lewin's Honeyeater, and Brown Gerygone, among others.

After lunch, we can take some longer walks in the magnificent Mountain Ash forests of the **Dandenong Ranges** NP, home of the Superb Lyrebird. After checking in and having dinner, there will be the option for a night walk in search of nocturnal wildlife such as Wombat or different species of Possums and



Gliders.
Overnight Healesville (BLD)

Day 4, October 3: AM Yarra Ranges National Park, fly to Hobart

This morning we will be birding in the mountains of the Yarra Ranges National Park. At these slightly higher altitudes the towering mountain forests hold a different selection of endemic specialties such as Yellow-tailed

Black Cockatoo, Pied and Grey Currawongs, Golden and Olive Whistlers, Pilotbird, Flame and Pink Robins, a variety of Cuckoos, Eastern Whipbird, and Red-browed Treecreeper, to name but a few. We'll also get another chance to see Gang Gang Cockatoo, King Parrot, Superb Lyrebird, Rose and Eastern Yellow Robins, Crescent Honeyeater, Crested Shriketit, Lewin's Honeyeater, and more.

Later in the morning and down off the mountain, we will make our way west across the northern outskirts of Melbourne again, making brief targeted stops along the way before the tour comes to an end at Melbourne airport, where we will catch a late afternoon or early evening flight to Hobart, Tasmania.

Day 5, October 4: Mount Field, Gould's Lagoon, transfer to Bruny Island Today we will travel to Mt. Field National Park, which offers

spectacular scenery and pristine forests, looking for birds and other wildlife along the way. After returning to Hobart to check out of the hotel, we will take a ferry to Bruny Island for a 3-night stay at Bruny Hotel Lodge. All twelve of Tasmania's endemic species are found on Bruny: Tasmanian Native-hen, Green Rosella, Dusky Robin, Tasmanian Thornbill, Forty-spotted Pardalote, Tasmanian Scrubwren, Scrub-Tit, Yellow Wattlebird, Black Currawong, Strong-billed Honeyeater, Black-headed Honeyeater, and Yellow-throated Honeyeater. What was considered to be the Tasmania sub-species of the Boobook Owl is now classified as the Morepork, *Ninox novaeseelandiae*, the species found in New Zealand. In Australia, they are endemic

the species found in New Zealand. In Australia, they are ento Tasmania and are found on Bruny Island.

Overnight Bruny Hotel Lodge (BLD)



Days 6 - 7, October 5 - 6: Bruny Island

We'll spend two full days birding on the island targeting the endemics and the non-endemics that are more abundant on Tasmania than on the mainland, including Hooded Plover, Brush and Common Bronzewing, Swift Parrot, Flame and Pink Robins, Crescent Honeyeater, and the Forest Raven, Tasmania's only Corvid. Along the coast we should see Fairy (Little) Penguins, Black-faced Cormorants, Short-tailed Shearwaters, and other seabirds. At night we will spotlight for marsupials including Common Brush-tailed Possum, Bennett's Wallaby, Tasmanian Pademelon, Long-nosed Potoroo, and Eastern Quoll.

We will transfer back to Hobart to catch flights to Brisbane to begin the main tour.
